## AIRPORT SECURITY

Geneva Airport Visitors "Yellow" Badge – or valid Crew ID – are required to access the DABS premises.

**Badges must be worn and be visible at all time.**

Geneva airport Visitors badge holder:

- Must be accompanied by a DABS host at all time.
- Must be escorted by their DABS host at the end of each day to return their visitor's badge and retrieve their ID.
- A Geneva airport visitor's "Yellow" badge can only be used 5 days per period of 30 calendar days commencing the day of the first entry to DABS.
- A Geneva airport visitor's "Yellow" badge can only be issued for a maximum use of 14 days per year.
- By wearing a Geneva Airport Badge or a Crew ID on DABS premises, visitor agrees to comply with all DABS and Geneva airport rules and regulations.

**DABS premises (H1, H2 & H3 maintenance hangars, building entrances, tarmac and vehicle car park are monitored by CCTV 24/7).**

For more information, please contact your DABS Host (TAG3374 standard refers).

The airport perimeters are also monitored by Geneva Airport CCTV.

**No photography or videography is permitted on DABS premises** unless previously agreed by your DABS host. In any case no third party aircraft registration / distinctive livery must be visible on the photo / video. A filming permit is required on Geneva airport perimeter outside DABS premise.



## SAFETY INFORMATION

**Access to hangars and aircraft is restricted:** all visitors should wear a visitors' airport (yellow) badge (or crew ID) AND a DABS visitors' badge (red lanyard).

Visitor must inform their CPM or DABS Host before visiting DABS. In DABS hangar, walk on the pedestrian aisles. Access to aircraft undergoing maintenance is permitted if justified for work reason after clearance has been obtained from CPM or A/C Chief in charge.

**Required PPEs must be worn at all times on the DABS site.** In particular: a high-visibility tabard must be worn on the tarmac, and safety shoes are mandatory in production areas (hangars, workshops, and stores) outside designated walkways. Safety overshoes (self-service) or safety shoes (on request) are provided for visitors. Smoking / Vaping is not permitted in the DABS buildings.

**Smoking / vaping** is only permitted OUTSIDE in the designated areas.

**Fire call points are located throughout the building.** In case of Emergency alarm (modulated tone) the building must be evacuated: follow the evacuation guide to the nearest exit point and do not use the lift. In case of fire call 118 (landside) or +41 58 817 42 48 (airside).

**First aid kit / first aider** are located throughout DABS: name and telephone numbers are displayed locally.

**A defibrillator** is located in the H1 building ground floor (hangar) and 3rd floor near HR (airside) & H3 building (hangar).

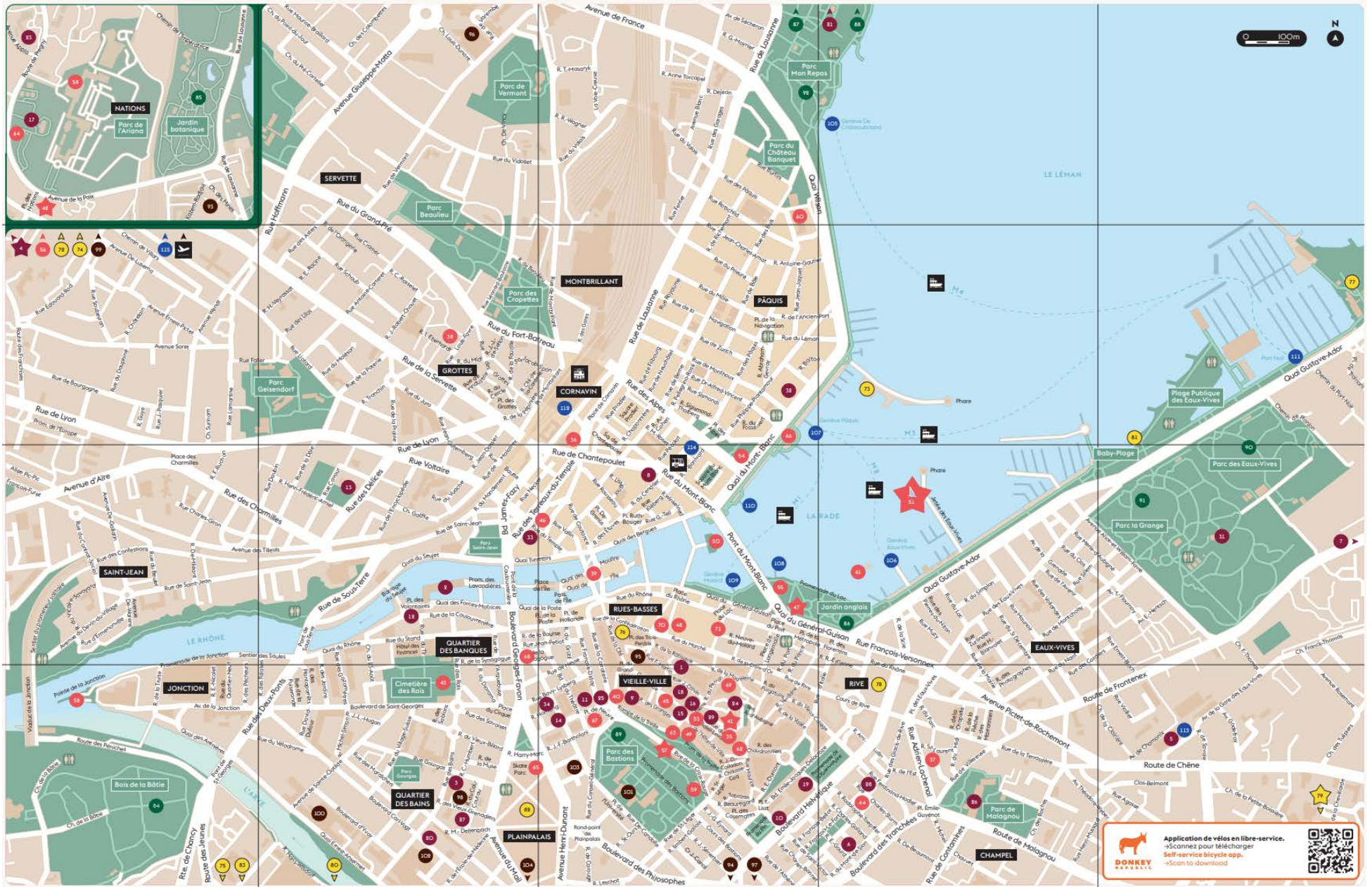

### HOLIDAY INN EXPRESS 3\*

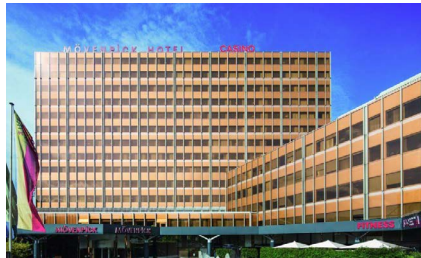

# WHAT TO DO?

## Places to escape in Geneva when it's cold and wet outside

### Visit the Red Cross Museum!

This amazing museum is so engrossing that it's worth visiting even on the sunniest of days. It's a moving testament to the best that mankind can achieve, though sadly usually as a result of the worst mankind can do. The Red Cross was the creation of a local man, Henri Dunant, and its story is well told here with interactive displays and modern visuals. It would take a hard heart not to be affected by some of the exhibits but the Red Cross itself provides the silver lining in every case. Closed on Mondays.

### Take a tour around the United Nations

The heart of international Geneva is the starkly beautiful Palais des Nations, home to the European HQ of the United Nations. Originally built to house the ill-fated League of Nations, the art deco building can only be visited on a guided tour. There's usually a wait to go through security but it's worth it to see the striking interior and learn about the workings of the UN. Bring picture ID with you. Closed on Saturdays and Sundays.

## Chill out when it's warm in the city

### Explore the old town

The most traditionally scenic part of the city is Geneva's Old Town, clustered on a hill around the Cathédrale Saint-Pierre and the pretty pedestrian Place du Bourg-de-Four. Start from Bourg-de-Four square and head into the network of narrow streets where you'll find plenty of watering holes for when your feet get weary, such as the charming Café du Bourg-de-Four, an unpretentious bistro with a lovely outdoor seating area. It's a great spot to sip some local wine and watch the world go by before wandering along the promenade for lovely views of the Bastions Park below and the Jura mountain range in the distance.

### Rummage in the Plainpalais fleamarket

On Saturday mornings there's no better place to be than at the Plaine de Plainpalais, which hosts one of Switzerland's biggest and best flea markets. From bric-a-brac to vintage clothes, second-hand toys to ethnic jewelry, plus larger pieces of furniture, a regular rummage among the hundreds of stalls could rustle you up a real one-off. When you've worn yourself out, prolong the vintage vibe by heading to 1930s café and ice-cream parlor Remor to watch the world go by from its outdoor terrace.

### Take a walk along the Jet d'eau!

Before it became a famous fountain, the Jet d'Eau was a safety valve used by the hydraulic plant distributing the driving force of the Rhône to Geneva's watchmakers. It was later made bigger and moved to become the famous Jet d'Eau. With a 140-metre-high peak, the water's exit speed is 200 kilometres per hour and its flow rate is 500 litres per second, creating a jet above the lake that weighs an impressive 7 tonnes

## NEAR BY

### Chill out when it's warm in the city

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#### Take a walk along the Jet d'eau!

As the name implies, this is one big jet of water, seven tones in fact, fired 140m into the air. It's impossible to miss the Jet d'eau and this city landmark be spied for miles around. Take a walk along the lakeside and, if you don't mind getting wet, venture out onto the pier to see the fountain up close.

There are plenty of boat tours that leave from one of Geneva's four docks at Pâquis, Mont-Blanc, Jardin-Anglais and Eaux-Vives for a stunning overview, take a cruise towards the upper eastern portion of the lake, with a photo stop at the glorious Chillon Castle right on the renowned stretch of scenery between Lausanne and Montreux.

## FURTHER AWAY

If you are brave enough to drive further away, here are some great places to visit within an hour drive from DABS.



### LAUSANNE

Lausanne is Switzerland's fourth largest city, situated in the French-speaking western part of the country. It's a beautiful city that is split between an old town on a hill and a picturesque lakeside resort on the shores of Lake Geneva.

#### Castle of Ouchy

Along the Ouchy promenade, you'll find many historical buildings and Belle Epoque hotels, but the Castle of Ouchy (Château d'Ouchy) deserves a few more words. It was built in the 12<sup>th</sup> century as a castle but at the end of the 19<sup>th</sup> century (1889-1893) was rebuilt and turned into a hotel. Now it still serves as a hotel and fine-dining restaurant.

#### Olympic Museum

Also in the Ouchy neighbourhood, you'll find the Olympic Museum, one of the most popular tourist attractions in Lausanne and an absolute must for sports lovers. The Olympic Museum takes visitors on a journey through the history of the Olympic Games and many exhibitions show items related to games like sports equipment, clothing, or medals from different Olympic

years. Outside the building, there is a beautiful garden with great views over Lake Geneva and the Alps as well as unique sculptures related to the Olympics.

### MONTREUX / VEVEY

Nestled on the shores of Lake Geneva and set against one of the most stunning backdrops of the Swiss and French Alps, the Montreux Riviera is an area of beauty not to be missed.

It attracts local and international tourists all year round as there are so many things to do in Montreux. Whether it is for the famous Noël de Montreux – Montreux Christmas Market, or for its famed Jazz Festival during the summer months.

#### Charlie Chaplin museum

The museum "Chaplin's World" is a unique combination of amazement, stories, and emotions. Enter into the world and visit where Charlie Chaplin spent the last 25 years of his life – at the Manoir de Ban estate.

#### Freddy Mercury statue

If you didn't know, Freddy recorded his last song in Montreux and with the band Queen spent a lot of time here in their recording studio. The statue is right on the waterfront of Lake Geneva and makes an ideal spot to admire the spring flowers of Montreux.

#### Chillon Castle

Chillon Castle is a romantic castle 2.5 kilometers away from Montreux. It was built by the house of Savoy and included in the Swiss Inventory of Cultural Property of National and Regional Significance.



## FURTHER AWAY

If you are brave enough to drive further away, here are some great places to visit within an hour drive from DABS.

### ANNECY

Nestled by the northwestern shore of its namesake lake, Annecy is the jewel of the Haute-Savoie. From its crowning Château down to its gurgling canals, the Old Town is infused with antique charm. Made great by the medieval Counts of Geneva and augmented by the Dukes of Savoy, Annecy still has numerous 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> century buildings, now painted in shades of peach and rose and housing restaurants, bakeries and boutiques. Canals trickle through town, earning Annecy its reputation as an 'Alpine Venice'.

### MASSIF DU JURA

Known for its gentle peaks and preserved nature, the Jura is ideal for travelers seeking tranquility and outdoor exploration.

These majestic waterfalls, located in the Jura Lakes region, offer a wide range of hikes. From a short 1.6km walk suitable for families to a long 11 km hike for experienced walkers, Les cascades du Hérisson are not to be missed.

#### Canyoning in the gorges

Experience the thrill of canyoning as you explore wild rivers, natural slides, and hidden waterfalls carved into the Jura's limestone landscapes. Whether you're jumping into clear pools or abseiling down cliffs, each descent is an unforgettable adventure in nature.

#### Sledding through the Jura's winter landscape

Enjoy a dog sled ride through the snowy wilderness of the Jura during several hours. Accompanied by a professional musher, you'll discover the basics of sled driving and learn more about these athletic and friendly dogs.

## NEAR BY

### SWISS SPECIALTIES

#### **Fondue**

Melted cheese ( often a mixture of Gruyère and Vacherin ) served hot in a fondue pot with bread dipped in it.

#### **Raclette**

Melted cheese scrapped over potatoes, with cold meats and gherkins.

#### **Rösti**

Pan-fried grated potato pancake. A typical accompaniment or main course.

#### **Papet Vaudois**

A comforting dish of stewed leeks and potatoes, traditionnaly served with a smokes cabbage sausage- a specialty of the Vaud region.

#### **Malakoff**

Deep-fried cheese beignets made with Gruyère, crispy on the outside and melting inside.

#### **Carac**

Chocolate tartelet with bright green icing, popular in French-speaking Switzerland.

#### **Meringue avec double crème de gruyère**

A crisp meringue paired with rich, creamy double cream from the Gruyère region.

#### **Bündner Nusstorte**

A rich caramel and walnut tart from the canton of Graubünden, with a buttery shortcrust pastry.
